## TERMS OF ADMISSION.

Candidates for admission into the Freshman Class are examined as follows:

## LATIN.

In nine books of Virgil's *Aeneid*,  
The *Catiline* of Sallust,  
Six *Orations* of Cicero,  
Twenty exercises of Arnold's *Latin Prose Composition*, and in Harkness' *Latin Grammar*.

## GREEK.

In three books of Xenophon's *Anabasis*,  
Two books of Homer's *Iliad*, and in Hadley's *Greek Grammar*.

## MATHEMATICS.

In Robinson's or Greenleaf's *Arithmetic*, in the first two sections of Robinson's *Algebra*, and in two books of *Geometry*.

## ENGLISH.

In Mitchell's *Ancient Geography*, and in Worcester's *Ancient History*.

All candidates for advanced standing will be examined in the preparatory studies, and also in those previously pursued by the class they propose to enter, or in other studies equivalent to them.

Certificates of regular dismissal will be required from those who have been members of other colleges.



The regular examinations for admission to College take place on the second Tuesday before Commencement, on Friday succeeding Commencement, and on Wednesday preceding the first day of the Fall Term.

## SCHOLARSHIPS.

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS.—There are ten State Scholarships (giving free tuition to ten students) in the hands of the Governor; and in bestowing them, preference is to be given to the children of those who have fallen in defence of their country, and always to students who are indigent and meritorious.

REDINGTON SCHOLARSHIP.—Endowed by Hon. ASA REDINGTON, LL. D., of Lewiston, by the donation of one thousand dollars—gives free tuition to one student.

DUDLEY SCHOLARSHIP.—Endowed by ALVIN D. DUDLEY, Esq., of Candia, N. H., by the donation of one thousand dollars—gives free tuition to one student.

FOLSOM SCHOLARSHIP.—Endowed by the brothers, FRANKLIN WILLIAM FOLSOM, Esq., MELVILLE MARK FOLSOM, Esq., and ALBION PARKER FOLSOM, M. D., of Oldtown, by the donation of one thousand dollars—gives free tuition to one student.

MORGAN SCHOLARSHIP.—Endowed by WILLIAM P. MORGAN, A. B., of North Yarmouth—income to be given to a member of the Senior Class who writes and delivers the best English oration.

## EXAMINATIONS.

All the classes are examined at the close of each term; privately at the close of the Fall and Spring Terms, and publicly at the close of the Summer Term.

## PRIZES.

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

*FIRST—FOR GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP.*

To the Junior Class—A first prize, the office of First Assistant Librarian, and a second of *eight dollars*.

To the Sophomore Class—A first prize, the office of Second Assistant Librarian, and a second of *seven dollars*.

To the Freshman Class—A first prize, the office of Third Assistant Librarian, and a second of *six dollars*.

*SECOND—FOR EXCELLENCE IN PUBLIC DECLAMATION.*

In the Summer Term—To the Junior and Sophomore Classes, a first prize of *eight dollars*, and a second of *five*.

In the Fall Term—To the Freshman Class, a prize of *ten dollars*.

*THIRD—FOR EXCELLENCE IN PUBLIC DEBATE.*

Each Term—A prize of *ten dollars*. The Sophomore and Freshman Classes elect six of their number to participate in each debate.

*FOURTH—FOR ENGLISH COMPOSITION.*

In the Fall Term—To the Senior, Junior and Sophomore Classes, a first prize of *eight dollars*, and a second of *five*.

## REMARKS.

The College has been in existence six years, and is named after BENJAMIN E. BATES, Esq., of Boston, Mass., who has donated to it \$100,000.

It was organized under its new charter in 1868. By this charter, beginning in 1873, there will be chosen five



Overseers every year—three by the Board of Overseers, and two by the Alumni from the Alumni.

*HATHORN HALL*

is named from the late SETH and MARY HATHORN, of Woolwich, who donated \$5000.

*PARKER HALL*

is named from the late Judge THOMAS PARKER, of Farmington, who donated \$5000.

*SKINNER HALL.*

At the annual meeting of the corporation in 1866, it was voted to erect, as soon as the necessary funds can be secured, a Library and Art Building, to be called SKINNER HALL, in memory of the late FRANCIS SKINNER, of Boston. The site is on the corner of College Street and Mountain Avenue.

*THE CALDER PROFESSORSHIP*

is called in honor of Rev. JAMES CALDER, D. D., of Harrisburg, Pa., who donates \$10,000 on its endowment.

*THE BARDWELL PROFESSORSHIP*

is called in honor of JOSIAH BARDWELL, Esq., of Boston, who has donated \$10,000 on its endowment.

*THE WARD PROFESSORSHIP*

is called in honor of GEORGE L. WARD, Esq., of Boston.

Mrs. JOHN M. FRYE and Mrs. ARCHIBALD WAKEFIELD have given to the College ten thousand square feet on the summit of David's Mountain (including a passage way to the same twenty feet wide) as a site for a contemplated Observatory.
