I BELIEVE WE HAVE SHORTCOMINGS AND WEAKNESSES. . . THAT AT OUR WORST, WE ARE NOT TOO GOOD.

BUT I ALSO BELIEVE THAT AT OUR BEST, WE ARE CAPABLE OF SOMETHING
BETTER THAN ANYBODY ELSE HAS EVER PRODUCED IN ANY OTHER COUNTRY. SO BEYOND

NOW -- TO PROVE THAT SOMEWHERE ON THIS PLANET, IT IS POSSIBLE FOR A SOCIETY

IT WILL BE A TOUGH AND DIFFICULT EFFORT. . . BUT ANY EFFORT WORTH MAKING USUALLY IS.

AND THE RIGHT KIND OF CAMPAIGN CAN BE SO REWARDING -- NOT MERELY IN POLITICAL GAIN -- BUT IN WHAT WE CAN ACCOMPLISH TOGETHER TO EASE SO MUCH VERY HUMAN PAIN:

- -- THE PAIN OF PARENTS WHO SEE SONS SENT OFF TO FIGHT AND PERHAPS TO DIE -- NOT FOR A CAUSE -- BUT FOR A MISTAKE.
- -- THE PAIN OF THE MINORITY WHO ARE BLACK AND THE MAJORITY WHO ARE WOMEN WHEN THEY FIND THEMSELVES EQUAL IN LAW, BUT NOT IN LIFE.

-- THE PAIN OF WORKERS WITHOUT WORK AND SENIOR CITIZENS WITHOUT
MEDICAL CARE AND THE VAST MAJORITY OF AMERICANS WHO WORRY WHEN THIS COUNTRY
IS TROUBLED OR DIVIDED.

AND WE CAN CHANGE THAT -- NOT JUST BECAUSE WE ARE DEMOCRATS OR NEW ENGLANDERS -- BUT BECAUSE WE SHARE A COMMON HOPE AND A COMMON RESOLVE -- TO USE THE NEXT YEAR TO BEGIN AGAIN TO MAKE OUR NATION AS GREAT AND AS GOOD AS IT CAN BE.

I KNOW YOU ARE READY TO HELP -- AND I AM GRATEFUL.

FOR MY PART, I LOOK FORWARD TO BEGINNING AT HOME IN NEW ENGLAND -DURING WHAT JOHN KENNEDY CALLED "THOSE FIRST SNOWY DAYS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE."
