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REMARKS BY SENATOR EDMUND S. MUSKIE SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

TUESDAY, JANUARY 25, 1972 -- 7:15 P.M.

I AM HERE TODAY AS A CANDIDATE FOR PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

I AM HERE TO ASK FOR YOUR HELP -- FOR THE HELP OF THE PEOPLE IN THIS COMMUNITY -- AND FOR THE HELP OF THE STUDENTS ON THIS CAMPUS, WHO ARE YOUNG ENOUGH TO BE IMPATIENT, AND OLD ENOUGH TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT.

I WANT YOU TO GET INVOLVED IN THE CAMPAIGN AHEAD. . . IF NOT FOR ME, FOR SOMEONE ELSE.

AND I WANT YOU TO KNOW EXACTLY WHAT'S AT STAKE.

THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY LOST THE ELECTION IN 1968 BECAUSE MILLIONS OF YOUNG AMERICANS DECIDED TO SIT IT OUT. TOO MANY OF THOSE WHO COULD HAVE VOTED DECIDED TO STAY HOME. AND MOST OF THOSE WHO COULD NOT VOTE REFUSED TO WORK. THEY THOUGHT THERE WAS NO DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES.

AND THEY WERE WRONG -- TERRIBLY AND PROFOUNDLY WRONG.

THE ELECTION IN 1968 DID MATTER, AND IT STILL MATTERS TODAY.

IT STILL MATTERS TO THE FIVE MILLION WORKERS WHO HAVE LOST THEIR JOBS.

IT STILL MATTERS TO THE TWENTY-FIVE MILLION PEOPLE WHO DO NOT HAVE ENOUGH TO EAT.

IT STILL MATTERS TO THE 2000 FAMILY FARMERS WHO EACH WEEK SEE THEIR LAND BOUGHT UP BY HUGE CORPORATIONS.

IT MATTERS TO THE FAMILIES OF THE TWENTY THOUSAND AMERICAN SONS KILLED IN VIETNAM SINCE RICHARD NIXON BECAME PRESIDENT. . .

TO OUR SOLDIERS WHO STILL LANGUISH IN COMMUNIST PRISON CAMPS. . .

AND TO THE CIVILIAN CASUALTIES IN SOUTHEAST ASIA, WHO SELDOM KNOW THE NAME OF THEIR COUNTRY, LET ALONE THE CAUSE OF THEIR DYING.

AND WHAT HAPPENED IN 1968 STILL MATTERS TO EVERY AMERICAN WHO WONDERS WHY OUR LEADERS WILL NOT TELL THE TRUTH.

YOU CANNOT SEPARATE YOURSELVES FROM THOSE AMERICANS AND THEIR NEEDS. THEIR NEEDS ARE YOUR NEEDS. THEIR FEARS AND FRUSTRATIONS ARE YOURS. THEIR HOPES AND DISAPPOINTMENTS ARE YOURS. AS MUCH AS ANY OTHER GROUP IN OUR SOCIETY, YOU ARE AMERICA.

YOU CARE ABOUT THE WAR IN VIETNAM -- NOT JUST BECAUSE IT
IS WRONG FOR YOU , . . WRONG FOR YOU TO FIGHT THERE AND TO DIE
THERE -- BUT BECAUSE IT IS WRONG FOR AMERICA.

IF I WERE PRESIDENT, I WOULD END THAT WAR WITHOUT

DELAY. I WILL END IT -- NOT BY DROPPING MORE BOMBS -- BUT BY

WITHDRAWING EVERY SOLDIER, SAILOR, AND AIRMAN FROM VIETNAM. I WOULD

END IT BY NEGOTIATING A SETTLEMENT IN SOUTHEAST ASIA . . .

FREEDOM FOR OUR PRISONERS . . . AND PEACE FOR THE PEOPLE OF

INDOCHINA. I WOULD DO THESE THINGS BECAUSE THEY ARE BIGHT . . .

RIGHT FOR YOU, AND RIGHT FOR AMERICA.

YOU ALSO CARE ABOUT THE HIGHEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN

TEN YEARS . . . NOT JUST BECAUSE YOU FEEL COMPASSION FOR DISPLACED

WORKERS WITH FAMILIES TO SUPPORT . . . BUT BECAUSE THE PROBLEM

REACHES INTO YOUR LIVES ON THIS CAMPUS.

IT TOUCHES THE ENGINEER FROM THE CLASS OF '71 WHO IS MOWING LAWNS INSTEAD OF BUILDING BRIDGES.

IT TOUCHES THE EDUCATION MAJOR WHO IS SELLING ENCYCLOPEDIAS INSTEAD OF TEACHING CHILDREN HOW TO READ THEM.

AND IT TOUCHES COUNTLESS COLLEGE GRADUATES EVERYWHERE,
WHO SPEND THEIR DAYS WAITING FOR A POSITION THAT NEVER SEEMS TO
OPEN UP.

AS PRESIDENT, I WILL FIGHT TO GUARANTEE A JOB FOR EVERY
WORKER. RICHARD NIXON HAS REFUSED TO DO THAT. HE HAS OPPOSED OR
VETOED VIRTUALLY EVERY EMPLOYMENT BILL THE CONGRESS HAS PASSED.
INSTEAD, HE GAVE US AN \$80 BILLION TAX CUT FOR BIG BUSINESS. . . A
NEW PROSPERITY WHICH WILL LEAVE UNEMPLOYMENT 40% HIGHER THAN WHEN
HE TOOK OFFICE.

THAT IS NOT GOOD ENOUGH FOR AMERICA. WE NEED NEW PROGRAMS. . . PROGRAMS WHICH WILL PUT OUR PEOPLE BACK TO WORK, IN THE HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES, THE PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS, THE STREETS AND THE SCHOOLS WHERE THEIR TALENTS AND SKILLS ARE NEEDED THE MOST. I PROGRAMS BECAUSE THEY ARE RIGHT. . . RIGHT FOR YOU. . . AND RIGHT FOR AMERICA.

THE MACHINERY WE CALL POLITICS CAN DO THESE THINGS

AND SO MUCH MORE. IT CAN FEED 300,000 HUNGRY CHILDREN IN MISSISSIPPI.

IT CAN KEEP THE FAMILY FARMER ON HIS LAND. AND IT CAN RESTORE

OUR FAITH AND TRUST IN GOVERNMENT.

IT CAN ALSO FAIL TO DO THESE THINGS. AND ITS ULTIMATE SUCCESS OR FAILURE MAY DEPEND ON THE DECISIONS WHICH YOU AND YOUR GENERATION MAKE IN THE WEEKS AND MONTHS AHEAD.

YOU CANNOT AFFORD TO SIT OUT THE NEXT ELECTION. YOU CAN DECIDE IT. YOU HAVE THE POWER TO VOTE, AND THAT MAKES YOU RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OUTCOME.

I NEED YOUR HELP. I NEED YOUR HEARTS AND YOUR MINDS AND YOUR SUPPORT. AND I NEED YOUR IMPATIENCE. IT WAS THE IMPATIENCE OF THE YOUNG THAT TURNED OUR PEOPLE AGAINST AN IMMORAL WAR IN INDOCHINA. AND YOUR IMPATIENCE CAN TAKE THIS COUNTRY TO A NEW PRESIDENT AND A NEW BEGINNING IN 1972.

YOU CAN START HERE, IN SOUTHERN ILLINOIS. YOU CAN HELP
ME BY HELPING THE CANDIDATES FOR THE ILLINOIS DELEGATION WHO ARE
RUNNING IN THIS DISTRICT PLEDGED TO ME. TWO OF THEM ARE STUDENTS
AND ONE IS A PROFESSOR AT THIS UNIVERSITY.

YOU CAN START HERE. . . AND YOU CAN RAISE A VOICE THAT WILL BE HEARD AND HEEDED IN THE FAR CORNERS OF OUR COUNTRY.

YOU CANNOT GO BACK TO OTHER TIMES. YOU ARE NO LONGER
WOODSTOCK NATION. BUT YOU CAN CHANGE AMERICA, HERE AND NOW. YOU
CAN MAKE IT BETTER THAN IT IS.

WILL YOU SETTLE FOR THE WRONG THE SYSTEM DOES. . . OR WILL YOU WORK FOR THE RIGHT THAT IT CAN DO?

WILL YOU SETTLE FOR AN OLD POLITICS, OR WILL YOU MAKE A NEW BEGINNING?

THAT IS MY QUESTION.

AND NOW I WOULD BE HAPPY TO ANSWER YOURS.

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
